<u>Policy:</u>

All employees and volunteers must have Working With Children checks registered to Warrnambool Uniting Church, sign a code of conduct and complete Child safety training.

Procedure:

A Child Safety committee will be established by Church Council to oversee compliance.

Child Safety Committee: Operating Guidelines

1. Role of the Child Safety Committee

- To ensure that the standards are met and adhered to, including that all volunteers of the Church have Working with Children Checks.
- Members to act as the contact person re child abuse
- To enact Synod's Guidelines re people who are unable to obtain a working with children check

2. Membership

- Two congregational members appointed by Church Council
- An Elder
- A member of the Ministry team
- At least one member to be a member of Church council

3 Meeting and reporting

- The committee will meet at least four times a year and report to Church Council subsequent to these meetings
- Additional meetings will be called as required and the committee will initially meet monthly, until the initial work is completed

<u>Review</u>

The policy will be reviewed in two years
